



A student shares in a group chat how a classmate lied about something they did over the weekend, even though there's no evidence. The group continues to share the messages with others, leading to the spread of false info and damaging the classmate's reputation.







A student says something in the group chat. Several people don't reply, and instead they create a side group chat to gossip and talk about the student.







A student says to another person in the chat:

oh that's what you're deciding to wear... interesting







A student visits a peer's parent's Facebook account to find childhood photos of that peer, screenshots some of them, and shares them around school without permission.







Student Challenge:

Analyzing and Debating the Affects of Group Chats on Friendships

Group chats have become a fundamental part of how many students maintain their friendships in today's digital age. 
