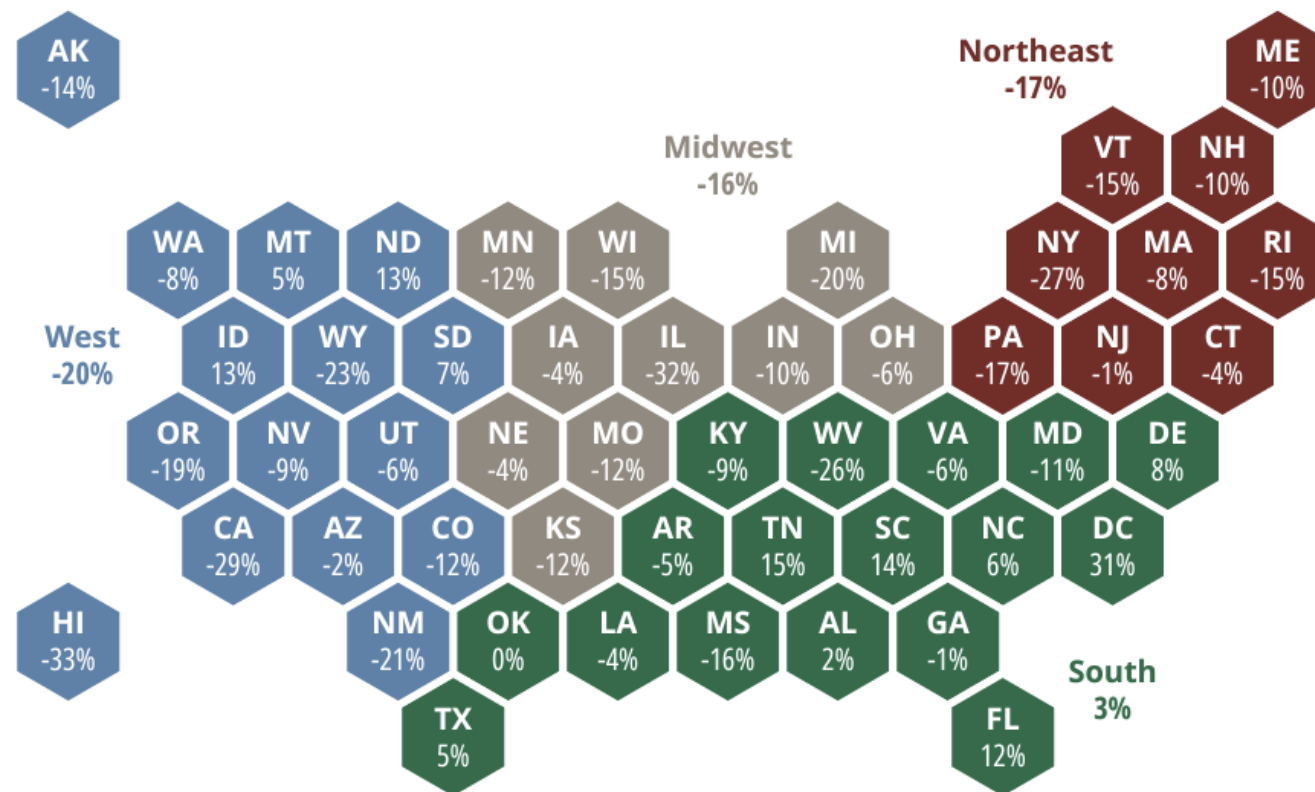

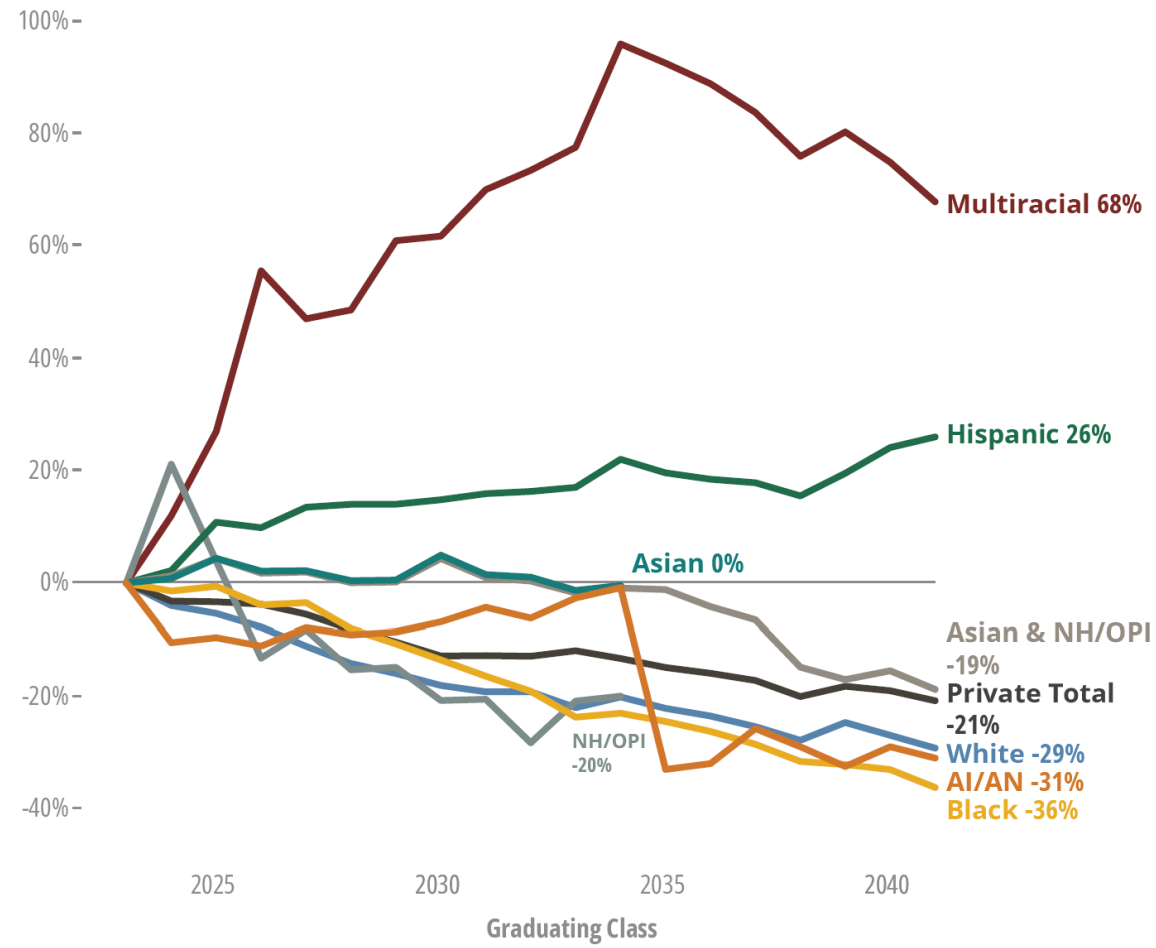
WICHE By State/Region – Declining HS Graduates

Colorado's student enrollment declines again, but more metro area districts saw growth

In a sign of longer-term trends, early grades have far smaller numbers of students than the high school grades, the data showed. For example, Colorado has 74,727 students in 12th grade preparing to graduate this spring, and 69,455 students in the class behind them. Meanwhile, this year's kindergarten class has just 58,604 students.

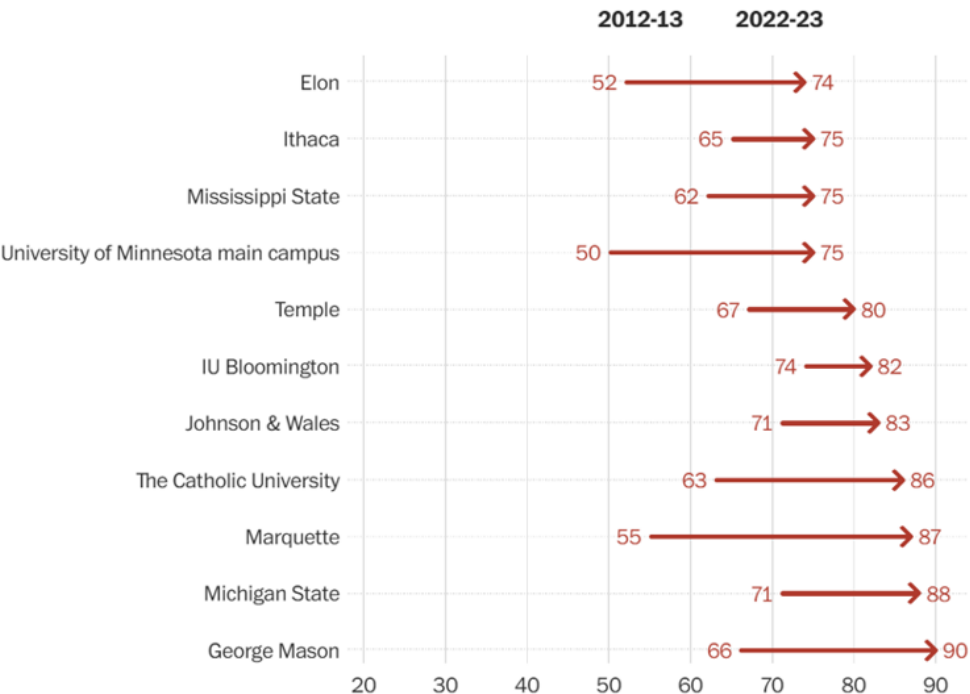

It's basic math. Enrollment has been going down for more than 10 years. Freshman enrollment this fall dropped by another 5 percent. And federal data show the number of high school graduates going directly to college has fallen from a high of 70 percent in 2015 to 62 percent in 2022, the most recent year for which the figure is available.

With a smaller supply of students, colleges are accepting a larger proportion of applicants. And with a projected decline in the number of 18-year-olds, Cooper said, it's likely that getting into college will continue to get easier.

Fordham spokesman Bob Howe said the university's acceptance rate went up from 43 percent to 54 percent between 2012 and 2022 in part because high school seniors are applying to more colleges, which "has required us to temporarily shift our acceptance rate."

The Campus Visit Is Changing

I recently participated in a virtual meeting with about 20 vice presidents of enrollment from across the country, and all but one were very worried about campus visit trends. In short, campus visits seem to be decreasing, and this is creating anxiety for all.

One of my colleagues shared that it seems as though “students no longer visit to determine where to apply, but instead apply to determine where to visit.” This comment was met with an unusual amount of agreement among the group. Such a dynamic no doubt changes what many of us have thought about the college search for decades.

I must confess: This is happening in my own home and I hadn’t even thought about it. I am the parent of a high school senior currently going through the college search, and I recently asked my wife about visiting a number of colleges on our daughter’s list. She responded, “Let’s wait to see where she’s admitted before arranging those visits.” I nodded in agreement but hadn’t really thought much about how easily that nod came until after that meeting.

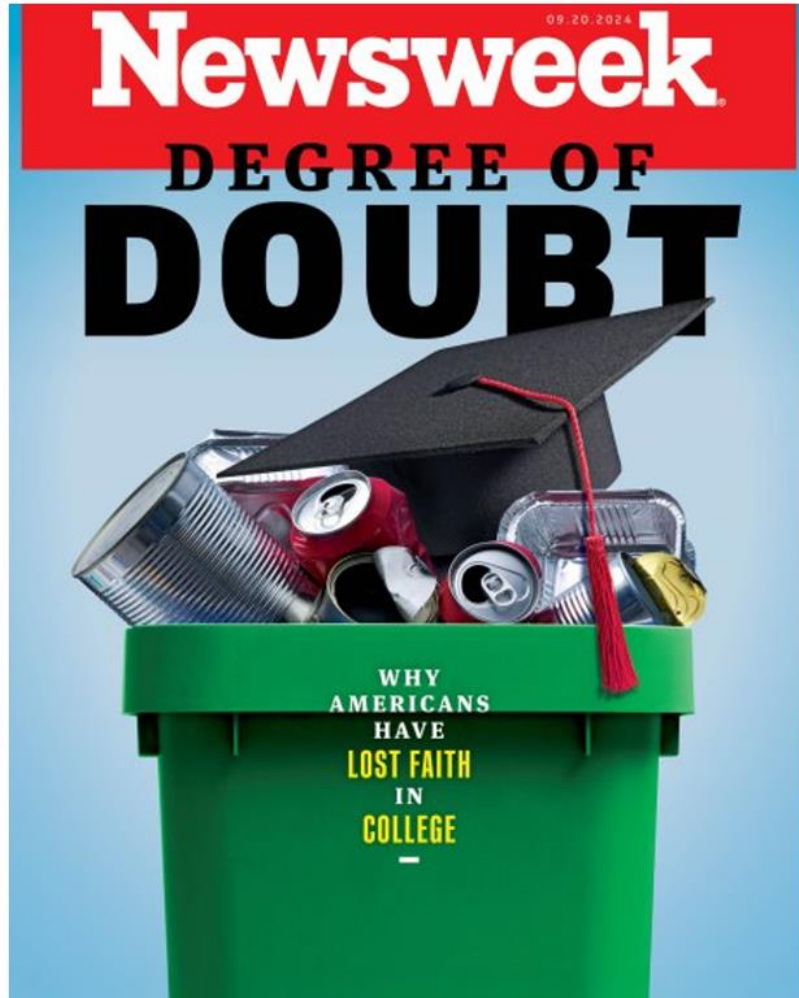

Media Scrutiny Continues



According to [a recent Gallup survey](#), a growing proportion of Americans are losing confidence in higher education. The survey, released in July, found that only about a third (36 percent) of Americans said they have a great deal or quite a lot of confidence in higher education, while 32 percent said they had little or no confidence. The numbers are significantly down from a decade ago, when 57 percent reported having a great deal or quite a lot of confidence in higher education and only 10 percent said they had little or none.



Hopping on the Affordability Bandwagon

On Tuesday, the University of Pennsylvania and Brandeis University both announced they were expanding their financial aid programs to a broader range of students. The next day, Carnegie Mellon, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and the entire University of Texas system did the same. The plans will make more lower- and middle-income students eligible for free tuition, with some raising the family income threshold to \$200,000.

Those five institutions join dozens of others that have rolled out similar initiatives this year: Dartmouth, Vanderbilt, Colby College, Duke, Columbia, Richmond and the Universities of Virginia and North Carolina, to name just a handful. So what's behind the flurry of affordability initiatives?
