### Workshop Description

This interactive session will consist of two parts. For the first hour, we will take a mid-year pause to look at structures and practices that lead to effective governance, and we will name some structures and practices that get in the way. Our focus will be on actions you can take to strengthen skills and activate engagement among members of your Board. After a break, we will pivot to a discussion about Major Gift and Capital Campaigns in schools and the important partnership required between Board and Administration for success. While Annual Funds seem to be fairly well-established in many schools, it has been awhile since many schools had Major Gift efforts and/or comprehensive capital campaigns. Institutional memory has been lost, and Boards are out-of-practice in terms of knowing what is involved and the important role trustees play. In addition to trustees and school heads, your school's Directors of Development/Advancement are welcome to join!
