



**Job Title:** Children's School Teacher

Classroom teachers plan, implement, and assess outdoor education experiences, language arts, math, science, and social studies curricula and work in collaboration with specialists in physical education, drama, Spanish, music, art, and computer science. Classroom teachers also serve as important resources for parents, helping them understand the school's educational philosophy and children's developmental needs.

CSS is currently seeking an experienced upper elementary teacher (grades 4 to 5) who is ready to provide direct instruction in language arts, math, science, and social studies, with a strong interest in supporting the social and emotional growth of each child.
